CELCOM CONTINUES TO PROVIDE AID FOR FLOOD VICTIMS

Celcom contributes relief goods worth RM150,000

KUALA LUMPUR, 19 JANUARY 2017 – As part of its on-going efforts to help residents affected by the recent floods in several parts of Malaysia, Celcom Axiata Berhad reached out to the flood affected families with essential supplies and provisions.

A total of 1,500 relief packs were distributed to affected families at the relief centres and homes located around Kuala Berang and Besut in Terengganu, Tumpat and Rantau Panjang in Kelantan. The relief packs consisted of basic food supplies and essential items that include blankets, towels, household supplies and many more.

Meanwhile, Universiti Malaysia Kelantan volunteers also provided assistance in Tumpat and Rantau Panjang.
